2	FX:	KNOCK KNOCK
3	POPPY:	Come in!
4 5	FX:	THE DOOR OPENS - STANDARD DOOR, RATHER THAN FUTURISTIC (BECAUSE WE'RE BACK ON MARS).
6		PAUSE
7	POPPY:	(WARMLY) Well? Do come in!
8	REGINALD:	After you, Honeybear.
9	HORACE:	(ACCUSINGLY) Oh don't even think about it
10	REGINALD:	I don't know what you mean.
11 12	HORACE:	You're putting on a show; he's putting on a show.
13 14	REGINALD:	I would $really$ like you to go through the door first.
15	HORACE:	And what if I don't want to? How about that?
16	REGINALD:	We can't fit through the door together!
17	HORACE:	No. I don't suppose we can.
18 19	REGINALD:	Right. Well if you won't go in first, then I will.
20	HORACE:	Typical.
21	FX:	TWO PAIRS FOOTSTEPS
22	POPPY:	Poppy. Pleased to meet you. And it's Reginald?
23	REGINALD:	That's me.
24	POPPY:	And Horace.
25	HORACE:	Hello!
26	REGINALD:	Will this take long?
27 28 29	POPPY:	It'll take as long as it takes, Reginald. If you'd like to shut the door behind you, and take a - oh!
30	FX:	ONE PAIR FOOTSTEPS
31 32	REGINALD:	Ah, this is our security detail, Fernando. You don't mind do you?
33 34	POPPY:	(TACTFULLY) Personally, I don't mind at all - and it is entirely your call - however it does

1 2		tend to enable more effective communication when the conversation is just between us.
3 4	REGINALD:	Nevertheless, Fernando is with us wherever we go.
5	HORACE:	(BITTERLY) Yes, he really is.
6	REGINALD:	Exactly.
7 8	HORACE:	Sometimes it's hard to go anywhere without Fernando being there.

10 11	HORACE:	In fact, sometimes it feels like Fernando is there even when he's not there.

16 17 18	POPPY:	Good. Now. First, I'd like to reassure you that here at <i>Poppy's Perfect Partners</i> we pride ourselves on-

20	HORACE:	Don't mind him, he's always like this.
21 22	REGINALD:	I just want to get things moving and solve this problem. Not that we have a problem!
23 24 25	POPPY:	And I can reassure you that you're in a safe space. You can say anything you like within these four walls.
26 27	REGINALD:	Then may I start by saying: "I don't want to be within these four walls."

14 REGINALD: Why do you ask?

15 HORACE: What is your reason?

18 HORACE: She wants to know.

19 POPPY: Yes I want to-

17 FX: CLICK OF TAPE RECORDER

18 REGINALD: (D) Where have you been playing, little

19 Estragon? Hmm? What's all this mud in our

20 kitchen? Oh no, those eyes won't work on me...

21 FX: TAPE RECORDER CLICKS OFF

22 REGINALD: Well I needed to solve the mystery of the muddy

paw-prints.

24 HORACE: Mystery?

25 POPPY: Would you say you're both active listeners?

26 HORACE: I would say I'm an active listener.

27 REGINALD: You see there's the most horrid mog next door

that I swear sometimes strays in through our

doggy-flap, and I didn't want to jump to

30 conclusions, but- What are you looking at?

31 POPPY: Let's try a different tack. If you don't mind

me asking; how are things - in the bedroom?

33 HORACE: Oh, wonderful!

34 REGINALD: Yes, now that we can agree on.
