10 11 12 13 14 15 16		My whereabouts? My quarters, captive until daybreak: a punishment imposed by Falconer, under security enhancements which I suspect relate to the alleged 'phantom astronaut' - doubtless a stress-induced delusion, or product of sleep-deprivation.
18 19 20 21 22		I would add the option of 'genuine supernatural apparition', if it were not for one compelling piece of evidence that briskly repudiates this theory, which is that I am not a simpleton.

1 2 [POSITIVE AGAIN] Freedom is imminent. And -3 given Falconer's customary military precision -4 I look forward to the door unlocking at 6 a.m. 5 exactly. 6 7 DICTATION DEVICE CLICKS OFF FX: 8 9 FX: ...AND ON AGAIN 10 11 BURNEY: [AWAKE AND READY] Burney's log. 6am IDP. 12 13 **PAUSE** 14 15 I am primed for liberation. 16 17 PAUSE 18 19 Any moment. 20 21 EXTENDED PAUSE 22 23 24 MUSIC: INTRO THEME 25 26 27 28 29 SCENE ONE: INT. BURNEY'S QUARTERS 30 31 DICTATION DEVICE IS SWITCHED ON. FX: 32 33 BURNEY: Burney's log. Day two. 11.04am IDP. 34 35 If I have learned anything during this stretch 36 of isolation, it is conversational Sanskrit. 37 38 If I have learned anything else, it is of 39 Falconer's new realms of unpredictability. 40 41 Extreme behaviour is not unusual per se... Take the recent incident of the fudgey frozen 42 43 yoghurt. 44 45 Both Lowell and I coveted the remaining scoop, 46 and when we entered into a reasonable - if 47 vociferous - debate, Falconer snatched the tub, 48 thrust it into the microwave oven, and...

detonated the appliance with her laser blaster.

1 And yet this current scenario still feels... 2 unprecedented. 3 4 Either Falconer intentionally lied about the 5 duration of incarceration to encourage us to 6 acquiesce. 7 8 Or she did not lie, and is incapacitated and/or 9 dead. 10 11 I hope not the latter. She is just beginning to 12 become... kutūhala 13 14 BEAT 15 16 'Interesting', in Sanskrit. 17 18 I can only hope my colleagues are maintaining 19 their own sanity as I am. 20 21 FX: DICTATION DEVICE IS SWITCHED OFF. 22 23 24 SCENE TWO: INT. CHRISTY'S QUARTERS 25 26 FX: STATIC OF CAMERA RECORDING IN CHRISTY'S 27 **QUARTERS** 28 29 [SINGING] 'Twinkle twinkle little whelk; CHRISTY: 30 How I like to polish whelks.' 31 32 Oh Willoughby whelk; you're covered in grit -33 where have you been playing? You should try to 34 be more like Winona whelk - she always looks 35 spiffy. 36 37 What's that Waleed whelk? Yes I'm glad Falconer 38 let me bring you all in here with me too. 39 40 [SADLY] I know Wanda whelk. But that's the way it is, and the way it has always been. You 41 might want to fly; but something will always 42 43 hold you down. 44 45 [SNAPPING] Warwick whelk stop that! The 46 Commander knows exactly what she's doing. 47 That's mutinous thinking. And you know what the 48 penalty for mutinous thinking is: 49 50 No polishing for three hours.

1 FX: STATIC 2 3 SCENE THREE: INT. BURNEY'S QUARTERS 4 5 BURNEY'S DEVICE SWITCHES ON FX: 6 7 BURNEY: Burney's log, day two, 4.53pm IDP - and like a loquacious rhetorician with a penchant for 8 9 protracted verbalisation, I can now conclude 10 that this extended sentence is intentional. 11 My reasons are threefold: 12 13 14 One: the hidden video camera in my quarters. I 15 noticed it while conducting an inventory of my collection of video cameras. 16 17 When I saw the unfamiliar serial code, the 18 19 interloping device suddenly projected like an 20 inflamed pollex. 21 22 Two: The door opened today, and a hovering 23 drone obstructed my escape, and deposited 24 nutritional tubed food, before the doors closed 25 once again. 26 27 Three: Orpheus has become unpleasantly 28 uncooperative. Observe: 29 30 [CALLS OUT] Orpheus? 31 32 [CHEERFUL AND SMARMY LIKE AN OVERZEALOUS ORPHEUS: 33 CUSTOMER SERVICE AGENT] Hiya! How can myself be 34 of service to yourself? 35 36 BURNEY: Why are we imprisoned? 37 38 I am programmed to follow the Commander's ORPHEUS: 39 orders. Is there anything else myself can help 40 yourself with today? 41 42 BURNEY: When may I leave my quarters? 43 44 ORPHEUS: Yourself's quarters are equipped with 45 everything yourself needs! Is there anything else myself can help yourself with today? 46 47 48 I wish to speak with Falconer. BURNEY: 49 50 ORPHEUS: [I'M SORRY BUT] Commander Falconer will not 51 listen to yourself at present. [CHEERFUL AGAIN]

1 Is there anything else myself can help yourself 2 with today? 3 4 BURNEY: Of all Orpheus' personalities, this has to be 5 the most brutishly unreasonable. 6 7 Addendum: The doors to my bathroom - which I share with Lowell - are rigged so as to only 8 9 allow one of us in there at any time. 10 11 This is a blessing. The toilet bowl resembles a 12 hostile political campaign at a Grand Prix 13 racing course: All smears and skidmarks. No 14 doubt a passive aggressive way to communicate 15 his ire. 16 17 Well, I hope he is using this time wisely: abandoning the absurd superhero fantasy and 18 19 grounding himself back in the real-world. 20 21 FX: DICTATION DEVICE OFF 22 23 24 SCENE FOUR: INT. LOWELL'S QUARTERS 25 26 WE OBSERVE THIS SCENE THROUGH THE VIDEO CAMERA 27 IN LOWELL'S QUARTERS 28 29 STATIC OF A VIDEO CAMERA. FX: 30 31 NOISE OF SCRIBBLING AS LOWELL DRAWS THE SCENE FX: 32 HE DESCRIBES 33 34 [D] The Bionic Belch sits atop a tall mountain, LOWELL: 35 flillions of miles from anyone. 36 37 He looks out over a world where he doesn't 38 belong. Up here, he cannot hurt anyone. 39 40 He cuts wood with an axe. Obviously he's got 41 laser eyes, but an axe is cooler. 42 43 Oh, and he doesn't need the firewood obviously, 44 cos he doesn't get cold, but see previous bit 45 about it being cool to chop wood. 46 47 He's also got a beard. Once he wanted a 48 moustache all the way down my tummy, but that 49 was when his dreams were childish. Now he's 50 wise, he's got a beard.

1 At the end of each day, he sits under the pink 2 sky and breathes in the air that he doesn't 3 need to breathe cos he doesn't need air. 4 5 He hears a noise. 6 7 It is a goat. 8 9 The Bionic Belch looks at the goat. The goat 10 looks back with a look that seems to say: 11 12 "You and me are the same. We're both good at 13 barging and eating things we probably 14 shouldn't; but that's not all we are. 15 16 "And I know I can't actually talk but if I 17 could talk I'd say all of this, so instead I'm 18 communicating it by looking at you in this way. 19 20 "P.s. your beard is awesome and looks a bit 21 like mine." 22 23 The Bionic Belch nods, to show he understands. 24 25 Then he says: 26 27 "I understand." Just in case the goat didn't 28 realise it from the nod. 29 30 Then the goat does a little widdle... and-31 32 FX: SCRIBBLING STOPS 33 34 [ANNOYED] Oh no, that was meant to be yellow! 35 36 BEAT 37 38 [GENUINE. ANGRY AT SELF] Idiot. 39 40 41 INTERIOR BURNEY'S QUARTERS SCENE FIVE: 42 43 FX: STATIC OF CAMERA 44 45 BURNEY: [SPEAKING CHEERFULLY AND OVERACTING] 46 47 Burney's log! Day eight of pleasant 48 recuperation! Today I shall tidy my drawers! 49 50 FX: DRAWER SLIDES OPEN

1 Behold! In this drawer is a completely 2 innocuous device! 3 4 FX: DRAWER SLIDES OPEN 5 6 And in this drawer is a screwdriver set! Why, 7 these are not in the correct drawers at all! 8 9 But one moment! I am suddenly overcome with the 10 urge to evacuate my bowels! 11 12 Oh dear! The pressure from my internal 13 digestive system means I do not have time to 14 discard these items! I shall have to convey 15 them to the bathroom where I shall do nothing 16 with them! 17 18 STATICKY BUZZ OF CAMERA FX: 19 20 SCENE SIX: INT. SHARED BATHROOM 21 22 FX: BURNEY'S DEVICE ON 23 24 BURNEY: [LOWKEY] I hope my performance was convincing 25 enough to allay suspicion. 26 27 I have formulated a plan, and believe this room 28 to be free of surveillance. 29 30 FX: A LITTLE SCREWDRIVERING, TAMPERING 31 32 [CONCENTRATING ON WORK] We were visited of late 33 by a psychopathic cyborg who gifted her augmented limb - capable of emitting a 34 35 superbolt of electricity - to me. 36 37 I am adapting the appendage to deliver residual 38 charge as targeted pulses, to temporarily break 39 the circuits in the doors. 40 I will test it on Lowell's bathroom door, and 41 42 secure his assistance. 43 44 FX: TAMPERING STOPS 45 46 There! Just enough charge for five pulses. 47 48 Now to use the screwdriver to tap out my plan 49 to Lowell in Morse code on these pipes.

1 FX: (THE FOLLOWING IS THE TRANSLATED BEGINNING TO 2 'DOOR WILL OPEN.' A LOUDER ITALICISED TAP COULD 3 SIGNIFY A DASH.) 4 5 TAP TAP TAP. TAP TAP TAP, TAP TAP, TAP TAP 6 TAP. TAP TAP, TAP TAP, TAP TAP TAP TAP, TAP 7 TAP TAP TAP... 8 9 TAPPING FADES OUT... 10 11 12 SCENE SEVEN: INT. LOWELL'S QUARTERS 13 14 FX: STATIC 15 16 A MUFFLED TAPPING OF THE PIPES. THE FOLLOWING FX: 17 TRANSLATES AS 'DO NOT REACT'. 18 19 TAP TAP TAP, TAP TAP TAP. TAP TAP, TAP TAP, 20 TAP. TAP TAP TAP, TAP, TAP TAP, TAP TAP 21 TAP, TAP. 22 23 LOWELL: [DURING TAPPING] Mm hhm. Yep. Yep. 24 25 OK. 26 27 Got it. 28 29 BEAT 30 LOWELL INDISCRIMATELY BANGS ON PIPES IN HIS 31 FX: 32 **OUARTERS** 33 34 [CHEERFULLY] I like to bang on things too! LOWELL: 35 36 STATIC FX: 37 38 39 SCENE EIGHT: INT. SHARED BATHROOM 40 41 42 BURNEY: Hmm. 43 44 Nothing else for it... 45 46 AN ELECTRICAL PULSE STARTS UP AND.. ZZZAP! FX: 47 48 DEVICE OFF FX: 49

2 3 4 5	FX:	STATIC OF CAMERA FUZZES IN. WE'RE NOW LISTENING VIA THE CAMERA IN LOWELL'S ROOM.

47 48	LOWELL:	And I might have still reacted - like I'm doing now.

1 BURNEY: You're still holding that grudge. 2 3 LOWELL: You can go away now. 4 5 BURNEY: I understand the incident on Calypso may have 6 aggrieved you. I am here now to help you 7 escape. 8 9 LOWELL: Escape what? 10 11 BURNEY: Our incarceration. 12 13 Our what now? LOWELL: 14 15 Being trapped. BURNEY: 16 17 Who is? LOWELL: 18 19 BURNEY: Us! 20 21 LOWELL: Are we? 22 23 BURNEY: Yes! For eight days! 24 25 LOWELL: Oh I see. Let's all play a joke on Lowell. Very 26 funny. 27 28 BURNEY: It is not a joke. 29 30 LOWELL: Yeah, well you said the same thing a few weeks 31 ago when you knocked on my door, and I said 32 'who's there', and you said 'Help, there's been 33 an incident in the lab and I need urgent 34 medical assistance', and I said 'Help, there's 35 been an incident in the lab and I need urgent 36 medical assistance who?', and you never 37 answered. 38 39 That wasn't a joke. BURNEY: 40 41 [ANNOYED] Then why did I laugh?! LOWELL: 42 43 BURNEY: Have you really not tried to leave? 44 45 LOWELL: I was thinking about going to get a pencil 46 rubber, but it'll be in downstairs storage, 47 which is basically miles away. 48 49 BRUNEY: You haven't even noticed the drone at the door 50 each day?

1 LOWELL: Eh? Nah my drawing desk faces the other way, 2 see? 3 4 BURNEY: Where did you think that pile of tubed food 5 came from? 6 7 LOWLEL: Oh man! Would you look at that! 8 9 BURNEY: You haven't eaten? 10 11 LOWELL: I have other qualities than eating all the 12 time, y'know! Besides, I've not been hungry 13 since somebody betraitored me. 14 15 Listen. Falconer has locked us up. I have BURNEY: 16 devised a way to escape. We must locate 17 Falconer, and stop this. Got that? 18 19 I see. Sounds serious. LOWELL: 20 21 BURNEY: Finally! Yes! It is very serious! Now. Do you 22 have any questions? 23 24 Do you call it a 'rubber' or an 'eraser'? LOWELL: 25 26 BURNEY: We must act now. Falconer is monitoring us. 27 28 LOWELL: How? 29 30 BURNEY: The camera. 31 32 LOWELL IS TEMPORARILY VERY CLOSE TO 33 MIC/'CAMERA' 34 35 Ohhhh! Thought this was an air freshener. LOWELL: 36 37 Why on earth would you think that? BURNEY: 38 39 LOWELL: Cos of the smell! [SNIFFS] 40 41 [APPRECIATIVELY] Mmmm. Like freshly soldered 42 wires. [SNIFF] And paranoia. 43 44 BURNEY: [HISSING UNDER BREATH] I am leaving, and given 45 your... skills, it would be useful if you came 46 too. 47 48 And there it is. You want me to barge the door LOWELL: 49 or laser it with my eyes or whatever.

1 If you need stuff broken, just ask Lowell. He's 2 a blunt weapon. Yeah thanks but I'll stay here 3 if it's all the same to you. 4 5 In this case, I do not wish for you to barge-BURNEY: 6 7 LOWELL: I'm not falling for your backwards brain stuff 8 this time either. 9 10 **BURNEY:** But your strength may come in useful for ... 11 [WHISPERING] overpowering Falconer. 12 13 [LOUD] You want me to fight the Commando?! LOWELL: 14 15 BURNEY: Not so loud! 16 17 No, I mean it this time Burney. I'm not just a LOWELL: 18 tool that you can use. It ain't respectful. 19 It's like-20 21 FX: HISSING OF GAS 22 23 It's like farting when I'm trying to talk to LOWELL: 24 you! 25 26 It's not me... It's the vents - it's-BURNEY: 27 28 ORPHEUS: Hiya! Myself has noticed that yourselves are 29 conspiring to approach Commander Falconer. 30 31 The penalty is sleeping gas. 32 33 BURNEY: We must leave. 34 35 Yeah, that's definitely sleepy gas. You can LOWELL: 36 tell cos it's browny-yellowy-green. You see, 37 the Bionic Belch has twenty-seven belches that 38 you can tell what they are by their different 39 gassy colours. Type one is-40 41 FX: PULSE STARTS UP 42 43 Burney; is that my sister's fist? 44 45 FX: ZZZAP AND DOORS SWISH OPEN. 46 47 Whoa! You're like a first person shooter! Like 48 in the Comrade Clarence game! Except with a 49 fist. 50

You're a first person fister!

1 2 Are you coming? BURNEY: 3 4 LOWELL: Nah. Cyborgs can breathe anything. 5 6 BURNEY: Did the Profoctor not chloroform you once? 7 8 LOWELL: Oh yeah! Never thought to question that. 9 10 Alright. But I'm only coming to get a pencil-11 rubber-slash-eraser from storage. 12 BURNEY: 13 Come on! 14 15 LOWELL: And while we're on the way, I'll remind you what the Bionic Belch's twenty-seven gas types 16 17 are. 18 19 CAMERA BUZZES OUT FX: 20 21 MUSIC: INCIDENTAL: 22 23 24 25 26 SCENE TEN: INT. CORRIDOR 27 28 CAMERA BUZZES IN FX: 29 30 LOWELL: And twenty-seven is the secret super belch. But 31 it's not been revealed what that one is, cos I 32 haven't worked it out yet. 33 34 BURNEY: You missed out one to twenty-six. 35 36 LOWELL: Oh yeah! So I did. 37 38 Falconer's installed cameras in the corridor. BURNEY: 39 40 [SNIFFS] Pungent. Hey! Christy's quarters are LOWELL: 41 that way. 42 43 BURNEY: She is surplus to requirements. And I only have 44 charge for three more pulses. 45 46 LOWELL: Nuh-uh. Ain't goin' anywhere with just you, 47 Bumface. 48 49 BURNEY: This is not a democracy. 50

What's that?

LOWELL:

1 2 An archaic form of government that enabled BURNEY: 3 people to vote, regardless of their merits. 4 5 I'm a people! Let's democracy! LOWELL: 6 7 BURNEY: It never did quite work. 8 9 LOWELL: We made a deal, remember? I'm not hanging out 10 with you. Get Christy, and I'll be hanging 11 around with her hanging around with you. 12 13 BEAT AS BURNEY CONSIDERS 14 15 Be quick. BURNEY: 16 17 LOWELL: Course. 18 19 Fist it. 20 21 FX: FIST WHIRRS UP AND ZZZAP!. 22 23 DOORS TO CHRISTY'S QUARTERS SWISH OPEN FX: 24 25 CHRISTY [FROM INSIDE QUARTERS] No thank you. I don't 26 want any more tubed food. 27 28 LOWELL: Christy it's us! 29 30 BURNEY: We're liberating you. 31 32 CHRISTY: Oh. 33 34 **BEAT** 35 36 No thanks. 37 38 Well, we tried. BURNEY: 39 40 LOWELL: You gotta come now before the sleepy gas 41 happens. 42 43 CHRISTY: The what? 44 45 FX: **HISSSS** 46 47 CHRISTY: Oh. 48 49 Christy. I believe Falconer is responsible for BURNEY:

this situation. We are going to the control

1 room to put a stop to it. If you wish to avoid 2 unconsciousness, you may join us. 3 4 CHRISTY: So the reason why there's sleeping gas is 5 because you opened the door. 6 7 BURNEY: Yes. 8 9 And if you hadn't opened the door, there CHRISTY: 10 wouldn't be sleeping gas. 11 12 BURNEY: Well... No. 13 14 CHRISTY: So when you say you're here to rescue me... 15 16 BURNEY: Whether you like it or not, you must decide: 17 stay or leave. 18 19 Oh, I don't do decisions anymore. CHRISTY: 20 21 LOWELL: Waddyou mean? 22 23 I've given them up. CHRISTY: 24 25 BURNEY: You've given up decisions? 26 27 CHRISTY: Yeppo. You'll have to decide for me. 28 29 LOWELL: Sounds like we need to do some democracying! 30 31 I don't have time for this. You may as well BURNEY: 32 stay here. 33 34 LOWELL: No, you need come with us! 35 36 I can't do both of those things. CHRISTY: 37 38 So I guess I won't be doing either. 39 40 BURNEY: [PERPLEXED] Then what will you do? 41 Perhaps I'll sort of 'pop out' of existence? 42 CHRISTY: 43 That doesn't sound so bad. 44 45 LOWELL: No! We'll vote again! 46 47 **BURNEY:** You can't vote again just because half the 48 voters didn't like the outcome of the first 49 vote!

[GETTING SLEEPIER] I'm going to do… that for you… now, Commander...
